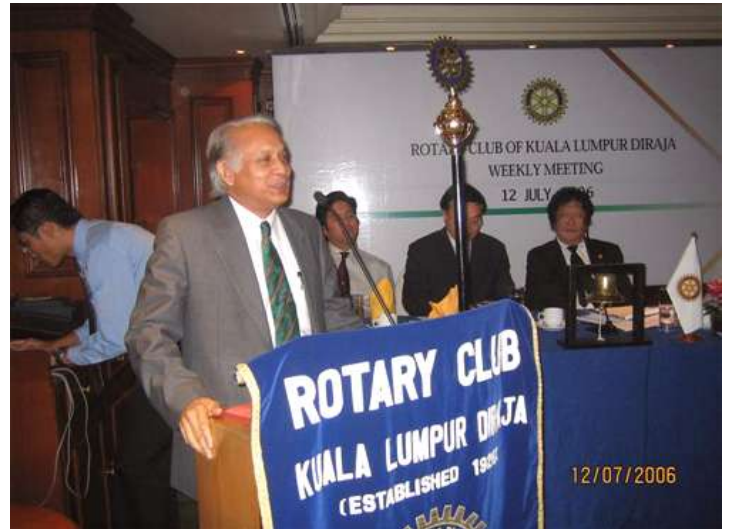
En Abdul Wahab gave us a very good account of what MSWG had achieved in the last six years and outlined some of the challenges that MSWG would face in the future.
