Pres. Rizal chairs his last Meeting 'Swan Song'

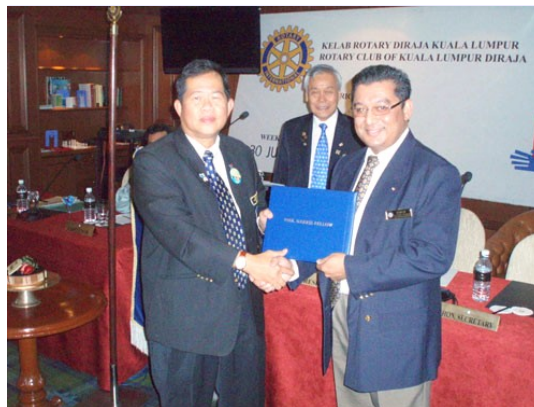
At the last meeting of every Rotary year the president makes his final report to the members on the activities and achievements during his tenure. In our club we call this the 'swan song' [the editor has no idea by whom and when this term was first used].

Outgoing President Rizal began with providing some interesting statistics – with 101 members we are still the largest club in the district [the next largest has 80 members]; RCKL's all-time giving to RI [TRF] adds up to US\$ 374,404; the target of US\$ 5,000 EREY contributions for RY 2009-10 was missed by around US\$ 3,000, but the club paid to TRF a total of US\$ 12,500; we have currently 48 PHFs and 3 benefactors.

Two PHFs raised their donation levels [Pres. Rizal to PHF+1 and Rtn Horst to PHF+2], and PDG Jimmy Lim has a total of 94,075 PHF points in his name through his generous donations over the years.

The PHF awarded to our former member and director, Tuanku Mukhriz, who is now the Yam DiPertuan Besar of Negri Sembilan has yet to be presented and Rtn Abdul Razak is working on the necessary arrangements.

Of the new PHFs for RY 2009-10 only two were present to receive their certificates - outgoing Hon Treasurer Richard Barrett and Rtn Ramesh Pillay.



Following awards were received - Presidential Citation; DG's recognition for our US\$ 3000 donation to the Polio Plus Programme; Presidential Citation for our Rotaract and Interact Clubs; Best Website Award for clubs of 25 members and more.

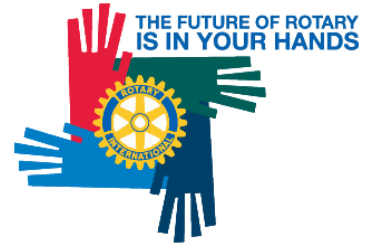

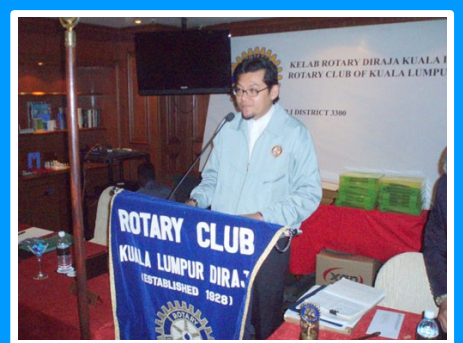

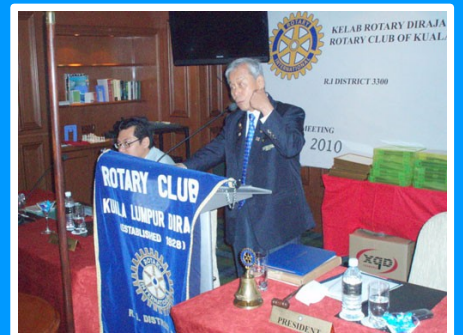

Pres. Rizal mentioned the Rotary Time Capsule's 10th anniversary early June and the celebration held to mark this occasion, which was covered by the press. The monument was designed by none other than PP David Teh and built during the presidency of Frank Lim and when the late Jaafar Ali was District Governor. During meetings with City Hall officials Pres. Rizal was assured that there were no plans at the moment to relocate the time capsule [repair and upgrading work needs to be done which hopefully will be executed as a district project].

The 'presidential project' for RY 2009-10 was the donation of a van to Pertiwi, an organisation handing out 200 food parcels to the homeless and hungry four times a week. The handover ceremony received good press coverage and the PR value (plus Rotary awareness) is further enhanced by our club's name and the Rotary logo prominently displayed on both sides of the van. The projects was supported by our sister club RC Phuket towards the cost of the van, the first time that club has been a donor for an overseas project.

Pres. Rizal also touched on the Abandoned Children's Home project which started in 2000 under the Magnum Rotary Trust but was stalled due the inability to find a suitable site and Magnum's wish to withdraw from the trust. With a new partner -

Bandaraya Development Bhd – the formation of a new trust is now possible, and this will be called Rotary BRDB Trust. It will undertake this project and Pres. Rizal suggested that the original trustees from our club be retained for this trust to ensure continuity. Incoming Pres. Andy Khoo will brief the members on the progress of the project.

Other matters finalised during Pres. Rizal's term include finalisation of audit of RY2006-07 and RY2007-08 accounts for the club and KL Rotary Charity Foundation; revision of KL Rotary Charity Foundation rules and the new composition of its management which will comprise 4 incumbent RCKL board members and 7 duly elected club members. This is to ensure continuity and more participation by club members in the management of funds held by KLRCF. The revision was speedily approved by the Registrar of Societies.

In conclusion, Pres. Rizal thanked the members for having given him the opportunity to be the club's president, hoping that they enjoyed having him as a president as much as he enjoyed having been the president. He quoted an American philosopher – There is no cure for birth and death but to enjoy the interval.

Future Vision Pilot is Launched (By Arnold R. Grahl - Rotary International News)

The Future Vision pilot, a three-year test of The Rotary Foundation's new, streamlined grant structure, is underway.

The pilot officially began 1 July, with 100 pilot districts that were selected from among hundreds of applicants in June 2009. The pilot districts will spend the next three years testing and helping to refine the Foundation's new grant model before all districts begin to participate in July 2013.

"I believe that through Future Vision, we will be able to serve our communities, and the world, in better and more effective ways," said Glenn E. Estess Sr., 2009-10 Foundation trustee chair, at the 2010 RI Convention in Montréal, Québec, Canada. "We will do the very most with everything we have. We will be able to address the challenges, large and small, that present obstacles to peace -- and dismantle those obstacles, one by one. Concentrating our efforts on bigger projects will have a greater impact and be more sustainable," said Jeremy Voizey, past governor of District 1120 (England), during a Future Vision networking session at the convention. Traditionally, we have done very well with the Foundation. This model should make life easier."

Pilot districts were chosen after a careful and rigorous review process, designed to select a group of districts that would

closely mirror the Rotary world. The 100 districts were required to make a firm, three-year commitment to the pilot and, before the launch, to appoint a district Rotary Foundation committee chair to serve for all three years. Pilot district governors-elect and Foundation committee chairs received special training during the 2010 International Assembly.

Two types of grants are provided for under the Future Vision Plan. Once a year, districts may apply for a block grant of up to 50 percent of their *District Designated Fund*. These *district grants* offer the flexibility to respond quickly to immediate needs or to plan projects with clubs locally or in other countries. Pilot districts may sponsor district grant projects with clubs in non-pilot districts.

Global grants support large, sustainable activities that relate to one or more of the areas of focus. Clubs and districts can either create their own global grant-funded projects or sponsor *packaged global grants* that will be developed by the Foundation in cooperation with its strategic partners.

The Trustees have approved a Rotary Foundation Global Grants

World Fund budget of US\$8 million for Future Vision pilot districts starting with the 2010-11 year. (Funds for the pilot districts were budgeted separately. The 2010-11 Matching Grants World Fund budget is \$21.5 million.)

The Foundation has already approved two *district grant applications* under the Future Vision pilot and is reviewing a number of others. District 3330 (Thailand) will use a \$39,500 grant to fund a variety of local projects, including buying books, computers, and sports equipment for schools; providing clean water for students; and adding patient beds at a hospital. District 1970 (Portugal) has also been approved for a *district grant*.

The first *global grant* was approved in June for a project to combat the spread of dengue fever in Indonesia. The Foundation has received more than 100 proposals for global grants.

The Foundation is also close to finalizing agreements with two strategic partners, and is reviewing a number of others.
